OUR SELF-EVALUATION REPORT AND IMPROVEMENT PLAN

In the last year, we have looked at teaching and learning in our school to find out what we are doing well. These are what we discovered are our strengths:

- The pastoral care of our students
- The positive atmosphere, the relationships, collegiality, and collaboration among staff.
- The emphasis on wellbeing with the roll out of the Weaving Wellbeing Programme at all levels.
- The success of the new Gaeilge scheme, Abair Liom and the increased use of ICT in this area.
- The continued improvements in Maths due to the embedding of daily Mental Maths and Tables practice
- The new emphasis on Oral Language Text Types, combined with Writing Genre and Comprehension Strategies being taught simultaneously throughout the whole school.
- Improvements in the areas of Oral Language and Gaeilge focused on in our School Improvement Plan.
- An increased use of Digital Technologies, in particular coding as part of the Shared Education Project

This is what we did to find out what we were doing well, and what we could do better:

- We examined daily, weekly and Standardised Test results
- We listened to feedback from teachers, from parents (e.g. at Parent/Teacher Meetings) and from pupils
- We focused on specific areas of Oral Language skills (i.e. Storytelling and Auditory Processing) and assessed pupil progress before and after the skills were taught.
- We observed our pupils' level of engagement and enjoyment in their work.
- We collated the results of a Pupil Questionnaire on the use of Digital Technologies.

This is what we are now going to work on:

- Continue to use the SSE process to implement the new Primary Language Curriculum which is to be rolled out in all classes during the 2019/20 school year:
- Continue to focus on the teaching of Oral Language Text Types, combined with Writing Genre and Comprehension Strategies.
- Introduce a new initiative called Accelerated Reading as a means to motivate pupils and improve their attainment levels in reading.
- Continue to focus on teaching a number of Oral Irish phrases at each class level & progress this up through the school.

This is what you can do to help:

Ensure your child does her homework every night

Listen to her reading and read with her and to her.

Encourage her to do 15/20 mins. of Accelerated Reading every night.

Talk to your child about what she is learning in school and show an interest in her work.
